Dear Friends,

The 2011–2012 year (March ending) was a year of stability and status quo for us. We maintained our program headcounts and staffing at steady rates, in contrast to the difficult previous two years. Most importantly, our children continue to learn and grow in tremendous ways, proving that it is in fact possible to change the lives of the destitute and help them become fully participating members of their society.

At Karunya Mane (“KM”) during the year, we:

- Hired two excellent and dedicated house mothers, one for the girls and one for the boys. As of March 2012, we stabilized our headcount at 23 girls and 22 boys, and support an additional for older children at a residential school an hour away for their higher studies.
- Re-enrolled two continuing students and started six new students at St. Francis, the excellent private school in the area. Seven of the eight students ended the school year (March 2012) with excellent results.
- Enjoyed continuing behavioral and health improvements in the kids at KM, including a greater focus on homework and becoming more self-disciplined.
- Hired an experienced counselor for the children, who holds sessions every Sunday. He is a dedicated and experienced professional with over 16 years of experience with children from the streets and slums. He also helps the staff to understand the needs of children from disadvantaged backgrounds.

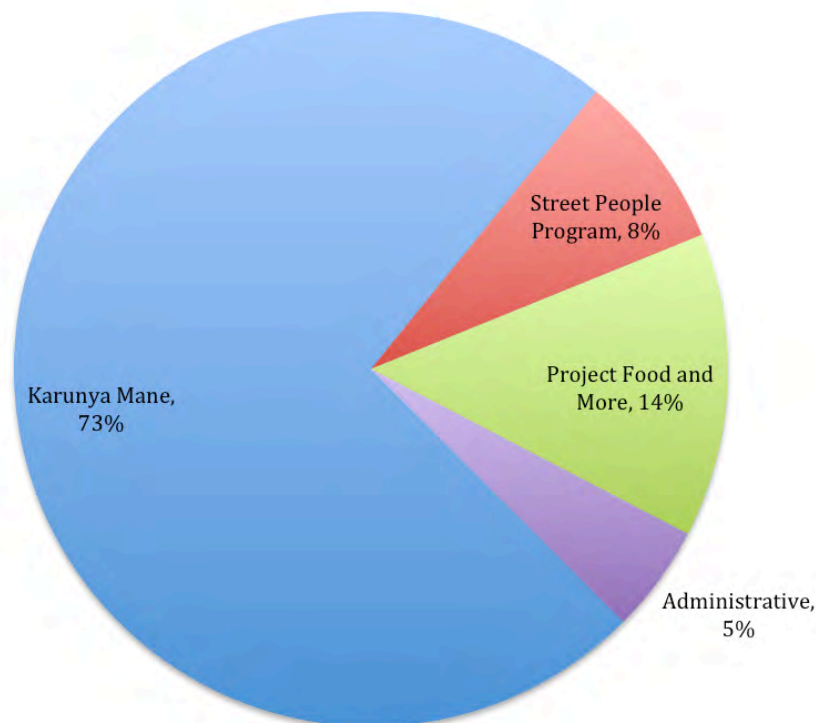
Our street moms continue to be relatively independent in properly caring for themselves and taking themselves to the doctor when needed. Moreover, the mothers with children at Karunya Mane are fully supportive of our efforts with their children and comply with our rules.

This past year, we were able to provide emergency assistance to one of our street moms who needed a home oxygen machine. Kumari requires such daily treatment, or faces a significantly shortened lifespan because of her badly damaged lungs.

Project Food & More ("PFM"), in its third year, continues to help kids orphaned by HIV/AIDS. PFM provides qualified kids with a monthly care package containing basic necessities and nutritional supplements, and a bit of cash. As of March 2012, we supported **51 children** and their guardians in this program, and a few single HIV+ women who have been abandoned by their husbands and communities.

We continue to use the support that we receive from you in an efficient and sensible way, as shown below.

### In 2011–2012, 95.1% of our expenditures went directly to the people we help.

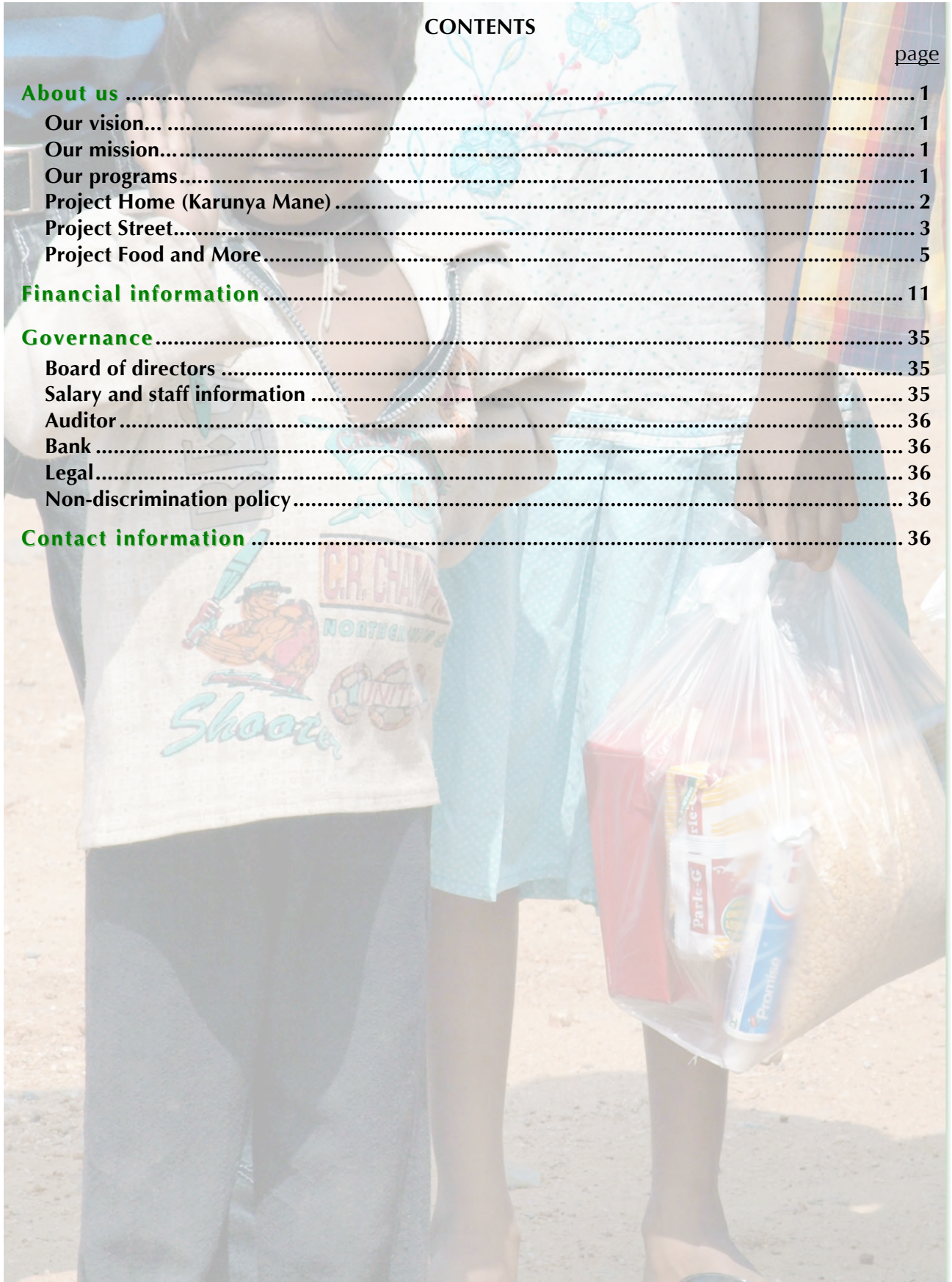

## About us

Akhandha Seva for International Shanti, also known as Operation Shanti, is a charitable organization with programs in Mysore, India. We serve the poorest children and their families living on the streets of Mysore or in abject poverty in slums.

### *Our vision...*

Operation Shanti envisions a world in which the poor are given the opportunity to reach their full potential in life. We endeavor to spread peace, goodwill, and hope throughout our world by helping the poorest and neediest gain status and their rightful place in their societies. Often, the poor are robbed of their human rights, are discarded, treated inhumanely, and ignored. The ultimate goal of our work is to give the poor back their rights as human beings.

### *Our mission...*

Our mission is to directly improve the lives of exploited, at-risk, destitute children and the forgotten, suffering elderly, enabling them to become “beacons of light” and share the same gifts of peace, goodwill, and generosity with others for the rest of their lifetimes.

We help the poorest and neediest children and elderly, and the forgotten destitute, with the basic human needs: food, shelter, medical services, and educational assistance. As we believe that every human can and should stand on his/her own, we are there to help the destitute begin to help themselves.

### *Our programs*

We have worked on the streets of Mysore (Project Street) with street children and their families since 2005. This program has acted as our feeder program to Project Home, our home for destitute street and slum kids (Karunya Mane)—although to see them today, after four years, you would not think they came from such a difficult environment. We also run Project Food & More (“PFM”), which supports destitute children orphaned by HIV/AIDS.

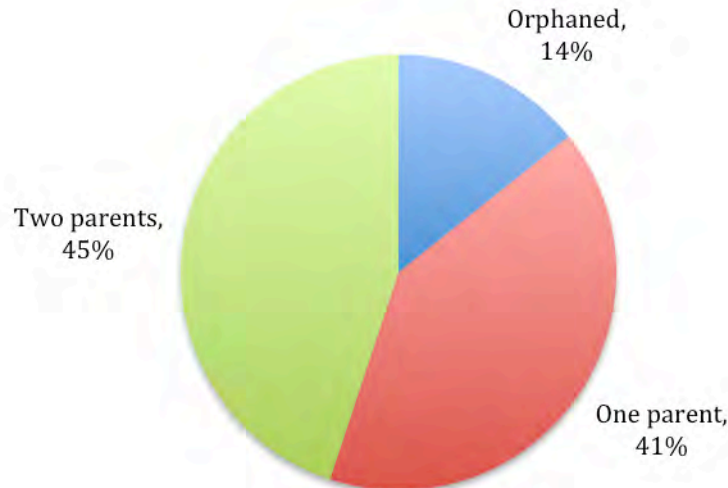

*Project Home (Karunya Mane)*

Karunya Mane has 22 boys and 23 girls. We also support four additional children at a boarding school an hour away; they return to KM during the holidays. The girls and boys at KM have separate quarters with a common eating area.

**Karunya Mane Kids – Family Structure

As of March 31, 2012, approximately 14% of the kids at Karunya Mane have no parents, another 41% have one parent—usually a single mother—and the rest of the kids (45%) have a mom and dad who are destitute and cannot properly care for their children.

We take in girls because they are the most vulnerable in this society. We take in boys because, without proper guidance, they are likely to grow up to be wife-beaters and alcoholics—the problem that many of our street and slum moms face with their own men.

Karunya Mane employs five permanent staff members, nine after-school tutors, a karate teacher, a drawing teacher, a singing teacher (as of July 2012), and a counselor. The children remain active and engaged, and education continues to be our focus—and it is paying off. Of the four children who have taken the nation-wide 10<sup>th</sup> grade exam (SSLC), all four passed, and two remain in school, continuing with their formal education. We



continue to be pleased with the kids' report cards, as a vast majority of the grades are A+s, As, and B+s.

This year, we started a mentorship program with a few young local professionals in the area who wanted to support and interact with our children at Karunya Mane. The mentors come on Sundays and spend time with their mentees (one to three older kids) for an hour or two, talking about schoolwork, life, and their experiences.

The mentors express enjoyment at doing such work with the kids and being able to give back in some way. The children truly enjoy the time they get to spend with their mentors.

### *Project Street*

During this, our sixth year of our Street People Program, we continued our work directly on the streets of Mysore, with assistance for 10 to 20\* children, mothers, and grandmothers. Our program has changed from prior years because most of the street children with whom we worked are now at our children's home, Karunya Mane. We continue to support their mothers, who now live in houses that we help rent for them, and who as street vendors selling flowers and vegetables. We provide them with a weekly stipend and medical assistance and, in return, these women have become a very useful resource for us in referring other poor women and kids to our programs.

Our core group of "street moms"—Kumari, Girija, Sushila, Lakshmi, Kaveriamma, to name a few—remain a loyal and excellent resource for us. These women assist us in helping other destitutes living on the streets and refer other street children to Karunya Mane. Because most of their kids and grandchildren now live at Karunya Mane, they have seen the positive changes in the behavior of their kids and are supportive of our work.

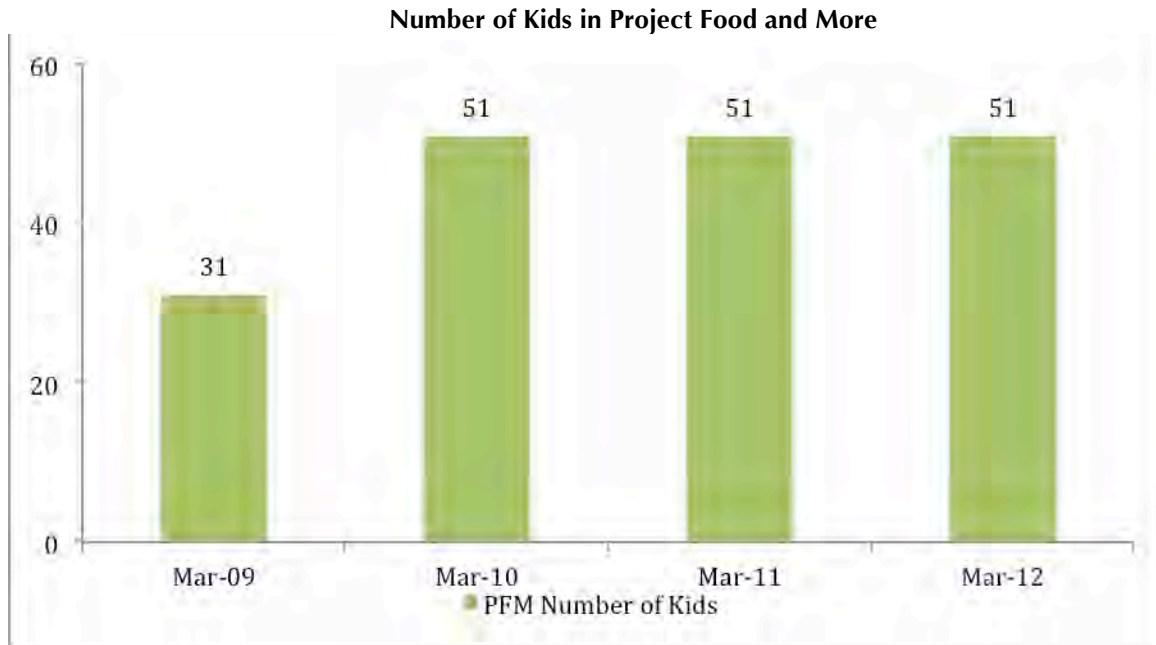

### Project Food and More

Project Food and More (PFM), started in September 2008 in response to a visible need to assist destitute children who have been orphaned by HIV/AIDS, has grown from 23 kids to 31 kids in March 2009 and 51 kids as of March 2012.



In January of 2012, the kids got an extra special treat, with two visitors in one day. The first set of visitors, a tour group from Canada, come by to say "hi" to the kids each year as they tour around India. The second set of visitors, our neighbors the Deepa Nagar Ladies' Group, brought a nice lunch for everyone and played games and gave out prizes to the kids.

*Project Food and More (cont'd)*

Qualifying for PFM requires that a child has lost one or both parents (or if there are two parents, both are unable to work given their health issues), and that the child's current guardian is very poor and struggles to feed him or her. We conduct due diligence visits to the living conditions of potential PFM candidates to ascertain that a child and his or her caretakers are indeed poor.

We provide a monthly care package for each PFM child. This care packages includes:

- Nutritional items such as lentils, protein powder, and healthy biscuits;
- Hygiene-related items such as mosquito repellent, bath and laundry soap, and toothpaste; and
- A small stipend.

PFM has been recently expanded to assist HIV+ women in the same way. A woman must meet certain criteria: has been abandoned by their husbands and families (usually the in-laws), may or may not be a single mother caring for her children alone, and has little or nothing in terms of personal resources and the means to earn a living. Most of the children live with a grandmother, an uncle or aunt, or the remaining living parent—often a positive mom. These guardians must now feed and care for an extra mouth or two, and often suffer greatly from additional responsibility.

We conduct due diligence through interviews and house visits to determine whether a child and his or her guardian is indeed poor. PFM kids and their guardians face many obstacles, including social stigma because of their health condition. Several mothers and children in this program were thrown out by their own families, who refuse to acknowledge them.

The situation has improved, with the government's efforts to provide free antiretroviral therapy and counseling. We endeavor to fill in the "holes" by providing nutritional and financial support to those who truly need it.

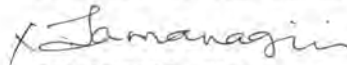

1. CORPORATE INFORMATION :

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities at the end of the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon management's knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from those estimates and revisions, if any, are recognised in the current periods.



Tangible Fixed Assets :

Fixed assets, are stated at cost. The cost comprises purchase price and directly attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition.

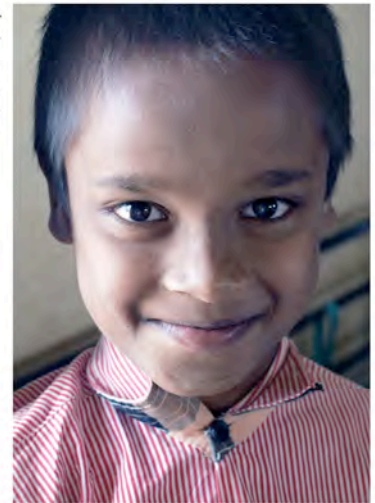
