Dear Friends,

The 2012–2013 (March ending) year was stable and productive for us. Our headcounts in our programs and for our staffing were consistent with that of last year, and the stability was a benefit to our children at Karunya Mane. Their grades are consistently good, their behavior is excellent, and we are seeing lasting changes in the lives of our children from our efforts.

Highlights of our work at Karunya Mane ("KM"):

- Two of our girls, Shilpa (2nd grade) and Mamatha (6th grade) were voted Best Students by their schools! We're so proud of them, particularly given their difficult family backgrounds.
- As of March 2013, our headcount was 22 girls and 23 boys at Karunya Mane, with an additional three older boys enrolled at a nearby residential school.
- We had eight continuing students and one new student at St. Francis, an excellent private school in the area. These nine students ended the school year (March 2013) with strong results.
- The kids displayed consistently good behavior and health improvements, including a more natural focus on homework and an increase in self-discipline and sense of responsibility.
- We hired an excellent singing teacher who gives singing lessons on Saturdays to the boys and girls. She is a highly experienced singer herself and teaches at a nearby private school.
- Generous donors from San Francisco gave the kids incredible playgrounds—one for the boys and one for the girls!





Our street moms continue to be relatively independent in properly caring for themselves and taking themselves to the doctor when needed. The mothers with children at Karunya Mane are fully supportive of our efforts with their children and comply with our rules.

This past year, with the help of generous donors, we were able to provide one of our street moms with a much needed a home oxygen machine and nebulizer. Kumari, who requires such daily treatment, continues to struggle with chronic lung damage.

Project Food and More ("PFM"), in its fourth year, continues to help kids orphaned by HIV/AIDS. PFM provides qualified kids with a monthly care package containing basic necessities and nutritional supplements, and a bit of cash. As of March 2013, we supported **54 children** and their guardians in this program, and a few single HIV+ women who have been abandoned by their husbands and communities.

We continue to use the support that we receive from you in an efficient and sensible way, as shown below.



2012-2013 Expense Breakdown

In 2012–2013, 98% of our expenditures went directly to the people we help.

This annual report features the everyday lives of the children we support, as well as key events during the year. Our focus on education continues, and is highlighted by the newly installed library at Karunya Mane, filled with books generously donated by various supporters over the past year.

We thank our supporters and child sponsors, who make it possible for our kids to enjoy their childhood and grow up to be responsible adults. Unlike the years when they lived on the street, our kids are now enjoying **just being kids**.

We continue to search for additional space for Karunya Mane, and our most difficult moments are when we have to turn away a destitute child who needs help for lack of space. We remain confident that, with the continued support from our generous and kind donors, we will be able to continue to help our existing children and any new children that we are fortunate to support.

About us

Akhanda Seva for International Shanti, also known as Operation Shanti, is a charitable organization with programs in Mysore, India. We serve the poorest children and their families living on the streets of Mysore or in abject poverty in slums.

Our vision...

Operation Shanti envisions a world in which the poor are given the opportunity to reach their full potential in life. We endeavor to spread peace, goodwill, and hope throughout our world by helping the poorest and neediest gain status and their rightful place in their societies. Often, the poor are robbed of their human rights, are discarded, treated inhumanely, and ignored. The ultimate goal of our work is to give the poor back their rights as human beings.

Our mission...

Our mission is to directly improve the lives of exploited, at-risk, destitute children and the forgotten, suffering elderly, enabling them to become "beacons of light" and share the same gifts of peace, goodwill, and generosity with others for the rest of their lifetimes.


We help the poorest and neediest children and elderly, and the forgotten destitute, with the basic human needs: food, shelter, medical services, and educational assistance. As we believe that every human can and should stand on his/her own, we are there to help the destitute begin to help themselves.

Our programs

We have worked on the streets of Mysore (Project Street) with street children and their families since 2005. Project Street has acted as a feeder to Project Home, our home for destitute street and slum kids (Karunya Mane) who exhibit few traits of being from such difficult environments. Project Food & More ("PFM") supports destitute HIV+ children orphaned by HIV/AIDS.

Project Home (Karunya Mane)


Karunya Mane houses 23 boys and 22 girls, and supports three children at a boarding school an hour away who return to KM during the holidays. The girls and boys at KM have separate quarters and share only their after-school tutoring space and teachers.



As of March 31, 2013, approximately 14% of the kids at Karunya Mane have no parents, another 53% have one parent—usually a single mother—and the rest of the kids (33%) have a mom and dad who are destitute and cannot properly care for their children.

We take in girls because they are the most vulnerable in this society. We take in boys because, without proper guidance, they are less likely to learn socially appropriate behavior and more likely to find themselves in trouble, or causing trouble, later in life—the problem that many of our street and slum moms face with their own men.

Karunya Mane employs eight permanent staff members (six paid, two unpaid), ten after-school tutors, two karate teachers, a singing teacher, and a counselor. The children are very active and engaged, and education continues to be our primary focus—and it is paying off. This year, our oldest children continued to progress in school, including Sreenivas who passed 1st PUC (11th grade), Harish who passed the SSLC exam (10th grade), and Manikanta who passed 9th grade. They are all continuing with their formal education.

Project Street

During this, our seventh year of our Street People Program, we continued our work directly on the streets of Mysore, with assistance for approximately 10 women. Our program has changed from prior years because most of the street children with whom we worked are now at our children's home, Karunya Mane. We continue to support their

mothers, who now live in houses that we help rent for them, and who as street vendors selling flowers and vegetables. We provide them with a weekly stipend and medical assistance and, in return, these women have become a very useful resource for us in referring other poor women and kids to our programs.

This year, we lost Kaveriamma, a grandmother who lived on the street for at least 25 years. She passed away from heart complications, and left a great-grandchild, Venkatesh (who lives at Karunya Mane), a son, a grand-daughter-in-law, and two granddaughters. We and her friends miss Kaveriamma very much; she was a quiet woman who only wanted her great-grandson to have a nice home.




Our core group of "street moms"—Kumari, Girija, Sushila, and Lakshmi, to name a few—remain a loyal and excellent resource for us. These women assist us in helping other destitutes living on the streets and refer other street children to Karunya Mane. Because most of their kids and grandchildren now live at Karunya Mane, they have seen the positive changes in the behavior of their kids and are supportive of our work.




Little sister Jyothi and big sister Latha, who used to live on the street with mom Lakshmi and dad Lakshman. Mom and dad visit their daughters every month at Karunya mane. Jyothi is thriving in school; as a second-grader this year, she received all A+s on her report card. Latha was in fourth grade for 2012-2013 and struggles with her education but she maintains her friendly demeanor and positive attitude. Lakshman, and Lakshmi, both day laborers, are happy with the progress of their daughters.

Project Food and More

Project Food and More (PFM), started in September 2008 in response to a visible need to assist destitute children who have been orphaned by HIV/AIDS, has grown from 31 kids in March 2009 to 54 kids as of March 2013.

Most of the children in PFM have just a mother to take care of them; the fathers either died or ran away and failed to return. Some of the single mothers are on their own because of the stigma of having HIV; their in-laws or own parents often want nothing to do with them and their children.

Project Food and More (cont'd)

Qualifying for PFM requires that a child has lost one or both parents (or if there are two parents, both are unable to work given their health issues), and that the child's current guardian is very poor and struggles to feed him or her. We conduct due diligence visits to the living conditions of potential PFM candidates to ascertain that a child and his or her caretakers are indeed poor.

We provide a monthly care package for each PFM child. This care packages includes:

- Nutritional items such as lentils, protein powder, and healthy biscuits;
- Hygiene-related items such as mosquito repellant, bath and laundry soap, and toothpaste; and
- A small stipend.


PFM has been recently expanded to assist HIV+ women in the same way. A woman must meet certain criteria: has been abandoned by their husbands and families (usually the inlaws), may or may not be a single mother caring for her children alone, and has little or nothing in terms of personal resources and the means to earn a living. Most of the children live with a grandmother, an uncle or aunt, or the remaining living parent—often a positive mom. These guardians must now feed and care for an extra mouth or two, and often suffer greatly from additional responsibility.

We conduct due diligence through interviews and house visits to determine whether a child and his or her guardian is indeed poor. PFM kids and their guardians face many obstacles, including social stigma because of their health condition. Several mothers and children in this program were thrown out by their own families.

The situation has improved, with the government's efforts to provide free antiretroviral therapy and counseling. PFM fills in the "holes" by providing nutritional and financial support to those who truly need it.


